- Is used to promote/market materials

Passive Readers Advisory

- Booklists
- Physical Displays—in all forms
 - Single staff pick on a desk
 - Pulled out sections
 - Seasonal displays
 - Shelf talkers
 - Reading Maps
- Digital promotions—all of the above can be repackaged for digital use.

"Displays utilize library worker expertise for community interests, collections, services, facilities, and providing access to information and information resources. They introduce users and potential users to library resources and the library's role as a facilitator of information access."



Cozy SF/Fantasy

Forget monumental quests and bloody battles, the latest trend in sf/fantasy centers stories in which almost nothing happens. Unlike their epic counterparts, these books are light on violence, heavy on vibes, and usually contain a romance subplot. Readers are drawn to cozy sf/fantasy because of the creative world building, imaginative characters, and the feel-good, stress-free escapism the subgenre presents. Including characters from an orc who opens a coffee shop to a monk who travels the world serving tea, these cozy tales, which often feature strong queer representation, will delight readers looking for something chill but satisfying.

Can't Spell Treason without Tea. By Rebecca Thorne. 2024, Tor Bramble,

A queen's guard and her girlfriend, a powerful mage, must learn to trust each other while living together for the first time in a rural community, far from their previously dangerous lives.

Chilling Effect. By Valerie Valdes. 2019. Harper Voyager. This debut series-starter follows a starship captain and her crew as they contend with such threats as an apparent kidnapping, a cryostasis cartel, an interstellar tyrant, and psychic cats.

Half a Soul, By Olivia Atwater, 2022. Orbit.

A woman whose inability to feel was caused by a faerie lord stealing half her soul befriends the season's most eligible bachelor in this Regency-era fantasy that combines romance and mystery.

I'm Afraid You've Got Dragons. By Peter S. Beagle. 2024. Simon & Schuster.

This charmer from a subgenre star features a princess teaching herself to read, a not-very-heroic adventurer, a dragon exterminator who can communicate with the beasts, and journeys of coming-of-age and self-discovery.

Legends & Lattes. By Travis Baldree. 2022. Tor.

An orc retires from a life of fighting to open a fantasy city's first coffee shop in a novel with themes of defying stereotypes and trusting your friends alongside a slow-burn romance.

A Psalm for the Wild-Built. By Becky Chambers. 2021.

In this series-starter from the master of cozy sf, a monk loads up their wagon with spices and supplies and goes on the road, serving tea and listening to people's problems while searching for life's meaning.

That Time I Got Drunk and Saved a Demon. By Kimberly Lemming, 2024, Orbit.

This steamy, cozy fantasy that kickstarts a series features a spice farmer who learns the truth about a "threat" to her village only to find herself accompanying a sexy demon on his quest to take down a goddess.

The Very Secret Society of Irregular Witches. By Sangu Mandanna, 2022. Berkley.

In a cozy fantasy romance that celebrates family and trusting one's instincts, an orphaned witch is hired to tutor three young witches at a secluded house, which holds secrets and a librarian to whom she is inconveniently attracted.

Winter's Orbit. By Everina Maxwell. 2021. Tor.

An arranged marriage, palace intrigue, and a suspicious death combine in this romantic adventure with soft sf ele-

A solid Material or Collection policy is an important tool in responding to challenges/complaints/concerns.

Policy

Some libraries go a step farther and create Display policies as well.

Highlights of a CADL's collection policy that have been useful:

"1.6 Policy On Controversial Materials

The Library recognizes that many materials are controversial and that any given item may offend some patrons. Since the library does not promote particular beliefs or views, the collection inevitably will contain various positions, including unpopular or unorthodox positions. The presence of an item in the library does not indicate any endorsement of its content by the library. Selection of materials will not be made on the basis of anticipated approval or disapproval, but on principles stated in this policy."

Policy

"CADL considers reading, listening, and viewing materials to be individual, private matters and believes that full, confidential, and unrestricted access to information is essential for all patrons to exercise their constitutional rights. Responsibility for choosing what materials an individual will view, read, or consume rests with the individual. Although the staff exercises professional judgment in the selection of all materials, the responsibility for a minor child's use of library materials rests with their parents and/or legal guardians as more fully set forth in ser 102."

Have a solid process in place for complaints as well.

Request for Reconsideration forms can be created for both types of policy and force the complainant to write out their concerns.
