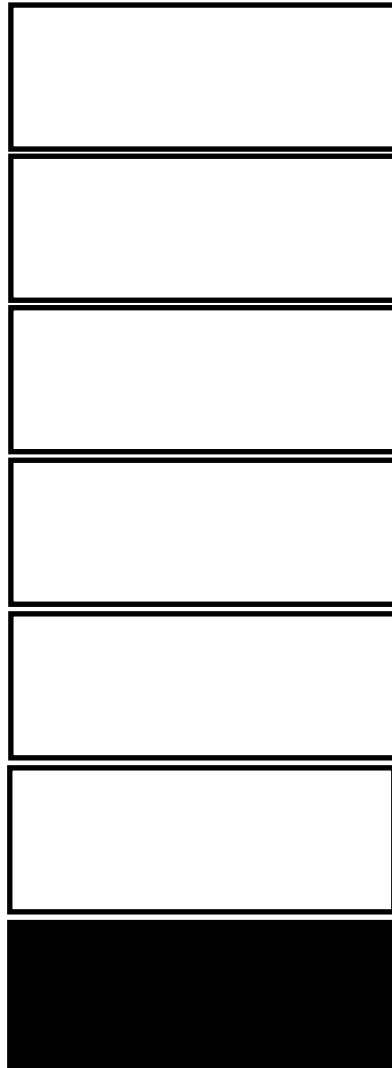
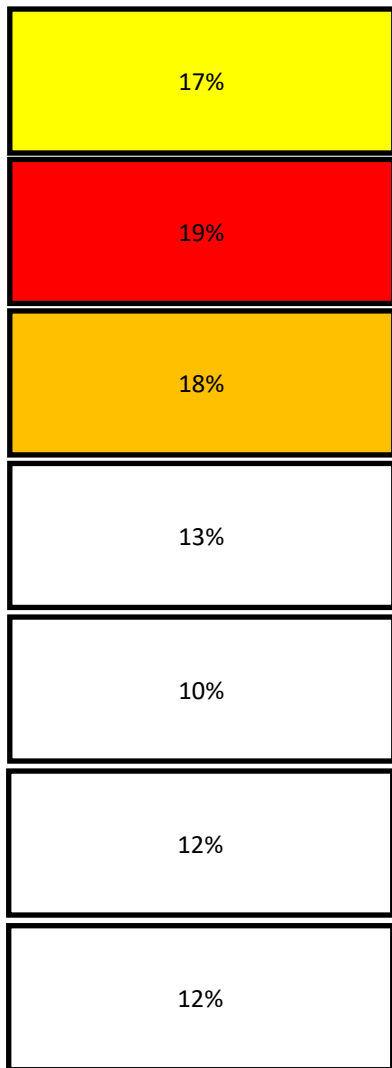


METHODOLOGY

- Figure out what you want to know.
- Choose a collection area to analyze.
- Pick two shelving units within that range.
 - Your goal is to have a cohesive collection for a comparison, but the most random assortment of items within that collection.
 - A variety of authors (for fiction) or topics (for nonfiction)
 - Similar types of items (children's, graphic novels, DVDs...)
- Record the barcodes from the items on the two shelves next to each other.
- Do this for each shelf in turn.
- Check the number of times that each item has circulated.
- Add them up for each shelf and then compare.

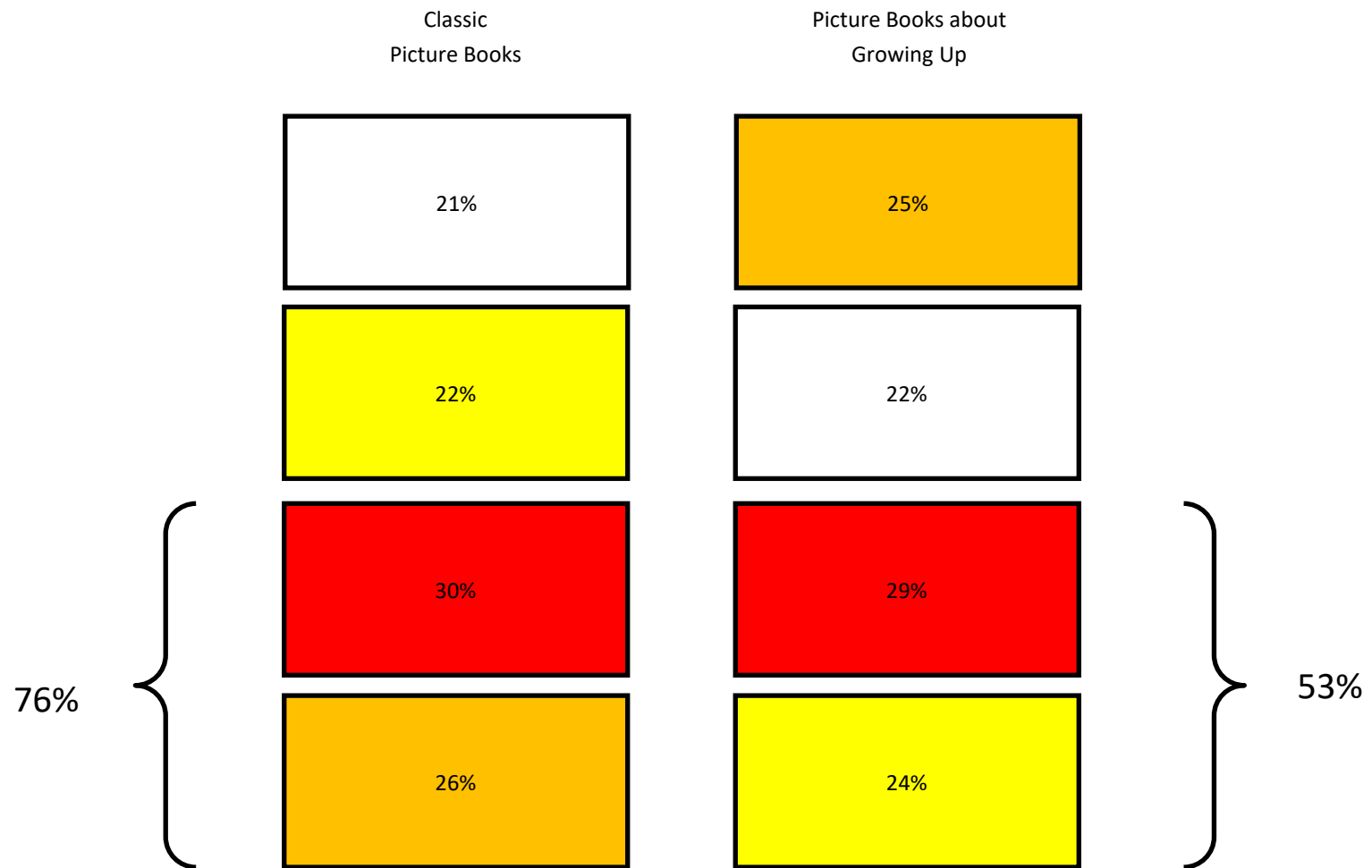


TEEN COLLECTION UPDATES

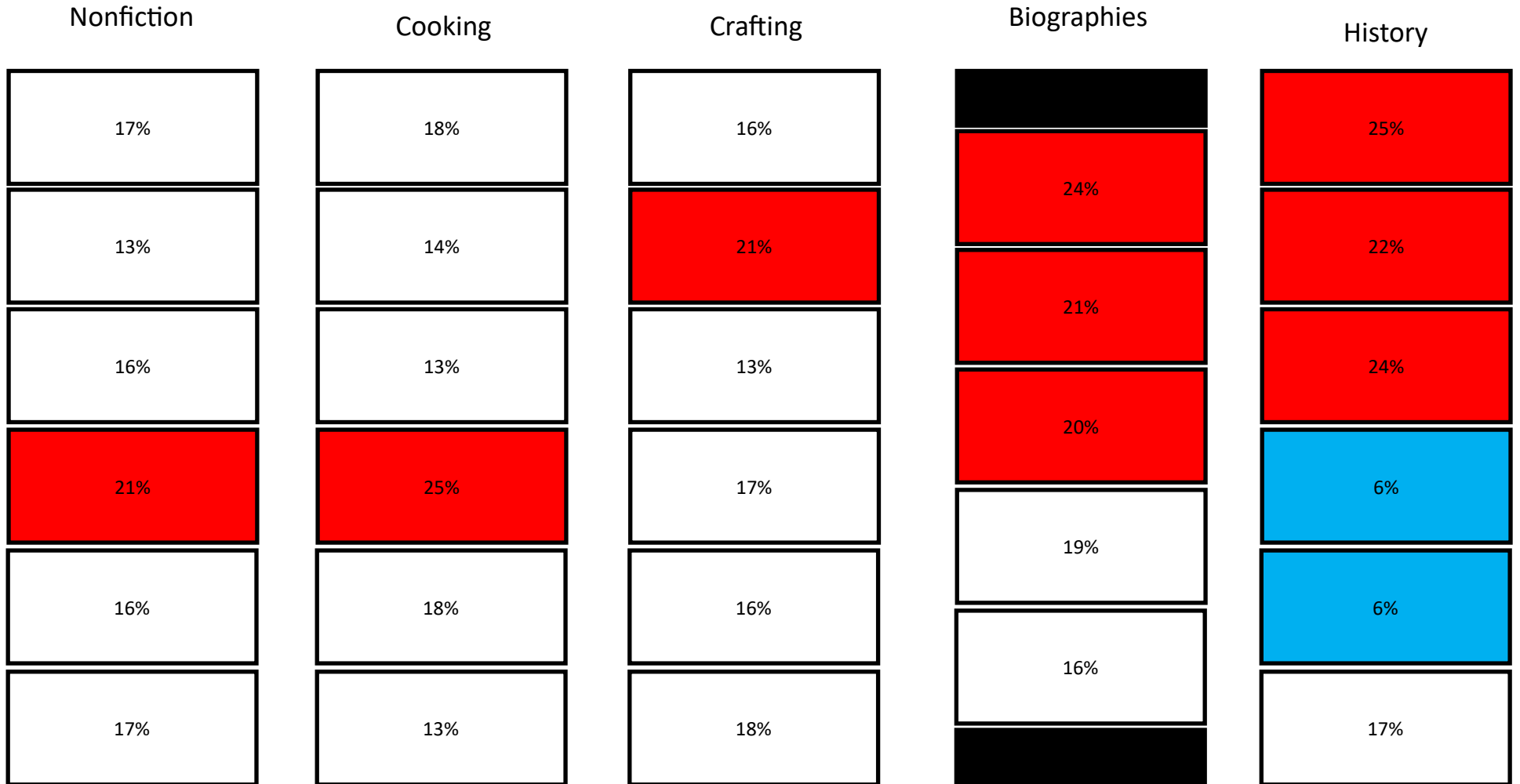
