



MICHIGAN LIBRARY ASSOCIATION SURVEY RESULTS 2019




HIGHLIGHTS

- The survey was distributed to a total of 2609 individuals (both members and non-members) in late August early September 2019. They had a period of 1 1/2 weeks to complete the survey and non-respondents were given reminders to do so. 480 people took the survey, meaning there was a 18% participation rate.
- The majority of the respondents are from the most heavily populated parts of the state Southeast Michigan and Kent County.
- The vast majority who completed the survey (83%) are from public libraries.
- Most of the survey respondents (79%) are current members; of these, 94% indicate that they are very likely or likely to renew their membership.
- Most people indicated that they chose to become a member because of 1) opportunities to network and build relationship; 2) educational opportunities (including the conference); and 3) advocacy efforts on behalf of the organization.
- For those who are not members that took the survey (79 respondents), they explained the reasons for not joining. Many did not perceive benefit to the membership or did not see the value in the programming. Others also mentioned their membership in other library associations. A little over a quarter indicated the costs are too high. In the comments section, a number of them mentioned that they feel the organization is more focused on public libraries than academic libraries.
- When examining the breakdown of the non-members that took the survey, 40 of them are from public libraries; 35 are from academic libraries; and 4 are from school libraries.
- Based on previous answers, it is not surprising that when asked about the common purpose of MLA, *Advocates for all libraries* and *Networking and Connections* were at the top of the list. This is important to consider when revisiting the mission statement.
- A little over half of the respondents gave affirmative answers as to the fit of the MLA mission. Other comments and suggestions are listed in the slide deck.
- When asked about the priorities of the organization, nearly 2/3 of the respondents put *advocacy/legislative agenda* at the top of the list. *Increasing awareness to the value of libraries* came in second on the list, with just over 1/2 of respondents indicating this is a priority.
- When asked about the key issues facing Michigan and the library sector that may impact MLA in the next 5 years, 1/4 of respondents listed *protection of federal and state funding* at the top of the list.




In which county is your library located?

Q2 Which of the following best describes the sector your library belongs to?




Are you a current member of MLA?






Q3 Are you a current member of MLA?




Q5 How likely are you to renew your MLA membership?






Why did you decide to become an MLA member? CHOOSE ALL THAT APPLY



Why are you not an MLA member? CHOOSE ALL THAT APPLY






