

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

Community engagement: what is it?

Most of our relationships within the community fall on the Inform/Consult side of the spectrum.

Want to move toward the Collaborate/Empower side of the spectrum.

The left side is more in line with Community Outreach (which is great!); the right side is Community Engagement!



FIRST STEP: DATA COLLECTION

Go into your community and ask questions!

Talk to a variety of people within the community (i.e. clergy, waitstaff, business owners, etc.)

Find prospective partners.

Community meetings!

Surveys!

TEEN ADVISORY BOARD!!!



NEXT STEP: MAKE A PLAN!

After collecting data, you have a better idea of what the community wants/needs regarding college/career readiness

Nail down your partner(s)!

This process should be collaborative!

Remember to BE FLEXIBLE!

Keep the data in mind all through the planning process!




After talking to stakeholders and partners, we opted to have a workshop focusing on empathy building (SEL) AND a series of programs focused on life skills.


"Turning Mirrors Into Windows" was the name of the Empathy workshop.





It is completely dictated by your community needs!


Some will focus on older teens.
