

STORY BOOK TRAIL BENEFITS

Story book trails bring picture books to a wide audience. Pages from story books purchased by the library are removed and mounted on display boards along a walking trail in a community park or garden. Book trails are typically less than a mile in length with 18 stations to read the entire story.

Story Book Trails encourage:

- Early literacy
- Family literacy
- Outdoor physical activity
- Engagement with nature
- Library visits

Community benefits:

- Story Book Trails foster a sense of community pride and excitement
- Adults anticipate reading the stories alongside children or on their own
- Story Book Trails are a destination place for visitors
- Monthly stories encourage multiple visits
- After-story activities bring patrons back to the library

PERMANENT OR TEMPORARY


Permanent

- Professional aesthetic
- Large and easy-to-read display
- Weather resistant
- Cost savings over time
- Easy to change stories

Temporary

- Good for brief or seasonal installations
- Easy to change locations
- Cost savings up front
- Location flexibility

DEVELOPING COMMUNITY PARTNERS



LOCATION


- Paved pathways provide ease of access for community members of all ages and abilities
- Park benches provide rest stops
- Playgrounds are incentive for kids to walk and read the story first
- Public restrooms are ideal
- Be aware of location specific issues like dampness, debris from trees, etc.




















CHOOSING BOOK TITLES

- 32 Pages maximum 2-page spreads over 16 pages, plus the cover and final page for acknowledgements
- Look for: rhyming, minimal text, contemplative or funny, involving nature, referencing location, or embracing themes (SRC or seasonal)
- Illustrations spanning 2-page spreads can be tricky
- Permissible MeL EBSCO Ebook Public Library titles

ASSEMBLY

- Books are disassembled with Exacto/Box Cutter blades, carefully trimmed, and taped into 2-page spreads
- Backing pages with footers are created in Canva and printed on a large-format printer
- Backing pages are trimmed
- Story pages are taped onto the backing pages, laminated, and trimmed

FIRST & LAST DISPLAY SAMPLES

BUDGET

Display Units	\$4434
4x4x12 Wood Posts	\$160
Acrylic Sheets (extra—10 per box)	\$136
Large-Format Printer	\$2695
Books (10-12 titles per year x 3 copies)	\$500
Ink Cartridges (\$160 x 6 ink cartridges)	\$960
Paper Rolls (3 rolls/box)	\$100
Total	\$8,985.00

WHAT'S NEXT?

Activity prompts and literacy tips encourage physical activity, engagement with nature and/or the story



Get readers moving. Ask them to skip, hop, run to the next page



Engage readers' senses. Ask them to look, listen, smell...



Engage with nature. Can they spot a bird, a flower, tree...



Engage with the story. Can you clap your hands three times quickly? How many bugs do you see on this page?



WHAT'S NEXT?

Invite patrons back to the library



Ask readers to answer a question about the story and return to the library to receive a small prize (bookmark, pencil, sticker), or enter a drawing for a larger prize (gift card) Example: Who is the Leaf Thief?



Invite patrons to attend a library program based on the story or season



WHAT'S NEXT?


Incentivize the story book trail



Create a poll to vote on upcoming story book titles



Create a reading challenge where patrons are encouraged to visit the story book trail throughout the season, earning badges (digital) or small prizes each month
