



#### Squirrel assaults force Montrose Library to close

MONTROSE — The Montrose Library has been closed indefinitely in the wake of an assault on a librarian by a band of marauding red squirrels.

"Yes, that's right," said Montrose Township Clerk Jackie Grice. "We've been trying to get rid of them since last year. But now they're getting to the point that they're charging people.

"We've called lots of agencies ... but no one will come out. I guess they're a blinger to get rid of."

The squirrels — officials guess they number about a dozen — have been in residence at the library, 126 E. Hickory, for more than a year. Until recently, though, they lived comfortably in the attic and walls of the converted one-room schoolhouse.

It was, Grice said, an annoying but not a serious situation.

THE CRISIS came to a head Saturday when 29-year-old librarian-Jane Orewiler was surprised twice by charging squirrels.

Orewiler said she and a library volunteer, concerned over increasing rodent activity, were examining the building's exterior for openings when several young reds appeared, apparently became confused and charged them in the vard. The two women were startled but managed to retreat without being harmed, she said.

An hour later, however, Orewiler was back inside at her desk when "one came out of the storage room and came at me.

"It was definitely charging at me," she said.

. What followed was, by library standards, pure pandemonium.

"I had something in my hand and I went after him," Orewiler said. "I'm afraid I scared the patrons, too, because I yelled."

Orewiler's counterattack won the day. She chased the renegade squirrel back into the storage room, slammed the door and called police.

By the time help arrived, the squirrel had disappeared, literally into the woodwork.

In the words of Grice, "They're kind of out of control at this point."

BECAUSE OF their concern squirrels may pose a health hazard to library patrons, many of whom are children, township and library officials decided Saturday to close the branch.

Orewiler has been reassigned temporarily to another branch of the Genesee District Library system.

The township, which owns the library building, is investigating options on removal of the pesky squirrels.

## 'Bug bombs' latest hope in squirrel war

MONTROSE — A resolution to the squirrel invasion at the Montrose Library, which forced its closure last week, may come as soon as today, a library official said Sundaya.

Library volunteer Nancy Shook said library officials intend to douse the building with "bug bombs," force the squirrels into the street, then close off all openings before re-entry is gained.

Grates have already been placed at suspected squirrel entryways on the building's foundation, she said.

The library, a branch of the Genesee District Library, has been closed since June 2, when young red squirrels charged at people on two occasions.

Library and township officials were concerned that the squirrels, which have been in residence for about 18 months, might be diseased and could infect library patrons.

Shook said several methods of removal, including live trapping and motibals, have been used unsuccessfully. Township officials also tried and failed to find a contractor who could remove the squrrels without killing them, which Shook said is required by the state Department of Natural Resources.

"Nothing else is working, so we're going to try bug bombs," she said.

Meanwhile, library patrons, including dozens of youngsters who signed up for a summer reading program Saturday, can't get to the books, she said.

"(The squirrels) have to go," Shook said, "We have no choice in the matter."










We collected all the cards and played the scavenger hunt game.






